DAY HIKE, MASSEY GAP to VA. 603 - SATURDAY, JUNE 4, 1983

This will be a moderate hike in the high country near beautiful Mount Rogers. We will enjoy a variety of terrain and good views from mountain meadows. Generally the hike will be a gradual downhill, somewhat long at 10.1 miles, but with few steep ups and downs. The trip from Kingsport is expected to take about ninety minutes. Bring good shoes, lunch, raingear, water and a flashlight. We will meet at B-215 at 7:30 a.m. and expect to return by 6:00 p.m. Some of us may stop for dinner on the way back. CANOE TRIP - N. FORK (HILTONS, VA to WADLOW GAP) I-II - SATURDAY, JUNE 4, 1983

SAND CAVE/WHITE ROCKS - Cumberland Gap National Historical Park SATURDAY, JUNE 11, 1983

Meeting Time: 8:00 a.m. at B-215 Drive Distance (round trip): 135 miles Hike Distance (round trip): 10 miles (moderate). We will drive to Ewing, Va from where we will ascend for about 4 miles along Brownies Creek Road to the Sand Cave. From there, we will proceed along Ridge Trail for one mile to the White Rocks. The Sand Cave is a 240' wide, 80' high cathedral-like room which formed as a result of stream erosion on a sandstone overhang. A small waterfall, high hemlocks, and the sandstone's rainbow coloring in shades from green to brown to pink make the cave location an awesome spectacle. White Rocks are massive cliffs that tower 3,000 feet above Poor Valley (U.S. route 58). These cliffs once served as a landmark to westward bound pioneers: at this point the pioneers were within a day's journey of Cumberland Gap. Bring water, lunch, rain gear, and comfortable clothing. CANOE TRIP - NOLICHUCKY GORGE, II-IV - SUNDAY, JUNE 12, 1983 (changed from Sat.)

We will meet at McDonalds, Colonial Heights at 8:30 a.m. and will be gone all day. As you know the Gorge section of this river is one of the best sections of Whitewater in the region and also very challenging. I plan to ask several experienced canoeists to come on this trip in order to assist any intermediates who have not run the Gorge but have been wanting to. This will be a good opportunity to move-up to more challenging Whitewater. For those who have already run the Gorge, you know the excitement and thrill it offers. DENNIS COVE ROAD to U.S. 321 - AT - SATURDAY, JUNE 18, 1983

This hike will start in Dennis Cove on the AT. The trail follows an old railroad grade for several miles, and then descends into the beautiful Laurel Fork Gorge near Laurel Falls. The trail then passes over Pond Mountain to U.S. 321, for a total distance of 10.4 miles. The hike should be rated moderate. Bring a lunch, and dress appropriately for the weather. The Nolichucky River is a favorite river for canoeists. Proper safety equipment is required. The trip will take the greater portion of the day, so plan to bring lunch and beverage. GRANDFATHER MOUNTAIN HIKE - SATURDAY, JUNE 25, 1983

As the cost to go up Grandfather Mtn. by car is now \$5/person, we will take the minimum number of cars to the top for our return. We will hike from the Invershiel Texaco station up Shanty Spring Trail to Calloway Trail to Grandfather Trail to the mile high swinging bridge. This will take us up on top of the ridges and peaks, weather permitting. The trail and views are quite spectacular. Descent will include coming down several long wood ladders so this is not a hike for preschool children. Overall rating: moderate to difficult. It can be cold and extremely windy on the ridges so come prepared. Bring lunch and water. On the way down there should be time to see the cougars, eagles, bear and deer.
