HIWASSEE RIVER CANOE TRIP, (I-II) - SEPTEMBER 17-18, 1983 OCOEE RAFTING (COMMERCIAL) - (II-IV)

This will be the first trip for TEC paddlers on the Hiwassee, a state scenic river. The Hiwassee flows through 90% forested areas which accounts for it's purity and clarity. The section we will paddle is wide and nearly all class I with about three class II rapids. It is suitable for beginners yet interesting for the more experienced paddler. We will canoe a 5 mile section located in the Cherokee National Forest about 20 miles east of Cleveland, TN. Pre-registration by 9-2-83 is requested because of the slight possibility that TVA will not be generating. Driving time is about 3 1/2 hours each way. If there is enough interest, some may spend Friday and Saturday nights at Twin Springs or Gee Creek campground near the river. CARVERS GAP to U.S. 19E - AT - SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 17, 1983 (M-D)

This hike will cover one of the most magnificent sections of the entire AT, through the "Highlands of Roan", an area of grassy balds and scenic vistas. Because of the distance (about 11 miles) and the considerable change in elevation, the hike should be rated moderately difficult. Bring a lunch, raingear, and sturdy boots or shoes. MT. CAMMERER - SMOKY MOUNTAINS - SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 1983 (D)

We will ascend Mt. Cammerer (elev.4928 ft.) from Cosby Campground (elev.2400 ft.) in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park VIA Cosby Creek and the AT. We will descend along the At to Davenport Gap (elev. 1900 ft.). Total distance will be about 12 miles. Mt. Cammerer is the northern most peak in the Smoky Mountains and commands a 360° view of the surrounding area. Bring your lunch and be prepared for rain, cool weather and windy conditions. Bring sturdy boots because the trail is rocky in places. Rountrip driving distance is about 190 miles and car poolers should expect a cost of \$16.00 per car.
