The 7th edition of the Appalachian Trail Guide for North Carolina-Tennessee is now available from the Appalachian Trail Conference (\$9.95 retail; \$8.46 for ATC members). This is \$1.00 less than the previous edition. All recent relocations are included and sections on geology, plants and animals, and history have been expanded. Collins Chew replaced Ray Hunt as Field Editor while Darrol Nickels again furnished the detailed trail data.

A.T.-DENNIS COVE TO HAMPTON - THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 1983 (E)

This is an easy, four-mile hike thru one of the most scenic portions of the Southern A.T., at a time when there should still be plenty of fall color. The Thursday date was picked to allow people who can't hike on weekends to participate. Bring lunch, water, and dress appropriate for the season. BAYS MT. LOOP - NOVEMBER 5, 1983 (M)

There is a loop trail in Bays Mt. BEYOND 6000 HIKE - SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 12, 1983 (M)

Rated as moderate, this Beyond 6000 hike will include two peaks, Clingman's Dome (6643) and Mt. Collins (6188). The hiking distance is 7.5 miles and the change in elevation about 1600 feet. The entire hike will be along the Appalachian Trail. Although some leaves may be down by this date, there should still be considerable color along the trail. These peaks are not in the Asheville water shed so we fully expect to climb them!

Departure will be from the parking lot in front of B-215 at 8:00 a.m. Driving distance is 125 miles each way. We expect to hit the trail by about 10:30 a.m. and be off of it by 4:00 p.m. Those who choose to drive straight back to Kingsport should expect to get home by 6:30-7:00 p.m. If some elect to visit in Gatlinburg, the return time will be later. Bring warm clothing (preferably layered), rain gear, sturdy shoes or boots, water, and lunch. If you like, you may wish to include a camera, binoculars, and a trail snack. Car pooling is planned and riders should collectively reimburse their driver about \$0.12 per mile. Reservations are not required; but if you plan to go, I'd appreciate knowing. (HUGHES GAP to IRON MOUNTAIN GAP - AT - SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 1983 (M)

This hike is rated moderate, with a distance of 8.1 miles and 2200 feet of climbing. Bring a lunch, water, sturdy boots or shoes, and clothing suitable for the weather.
