

This lodge (elevation 6593 ft) can only be reached by hiking trail. Supplies are brought in by llama train once a week. The hiking distance to the lodge is 5.5 to 7.8 miles one-way depending on the route. The package price this year is \$121 per person which includes supper on Saturday, lodging for the night, and breakfast on Sunday. Paddling GPS and Map Course, January 17, 2009

Debbie Reynolds reporting

On January 17th, Joe Harrison of Penn Virginia presented a class on basic GPS functionality as well as mapping. Richard Ruhlen was present and is extremely skilled at using navigation maps. We learned how to use the web and maps to determine coordinates and enter them into the GPS to use for tracking, since currents and wind can take you off track. We learned how to use the maps to find permanent buoys or other landmarks to use as guides. We also covered topography maps and how to determine the direction of a river. The class was at the new Penn Virginia office in Sheridan Square and we were using the board room. This was much more comfortable than being on the water on a very frigid day. A.T. Maintenance Reports

Reporting: Jim Foster **Date:** January 14, 2009

Purpose: Check trail for blowdowns and obstructions

Location: Section 16a, Trail south of Clyde Smith Shelter to Greasy Creek Gap

People: Jim Foster

Summary: There was snow on the Trail, and it was pretty cold, but a beautiful day none the less. I cut three small blowdowns near the blue blaze campsite south of the shelter. I'm assuming that these were the ones reported several months ago. The rest of the trail was clear and the water source (pipe) at Greasy Creek Gap (blue blaze)was still in good shape.

Summary: HardCore will be May 17-18, with plans to work at least the first day on the relo north of Wilbur Dam Road. Konnarock will be working on the Roan Highlands relos July 2-6 and July 30-August 3. A large scale wind energy facility has been proposed for a ridge near Mountain City. This would be visible from several points on our Trail section but is a minimum 10 miles from a not particularly noteworthy overlook. Darrol pointed out the need to know where the transmission lines would be located. The AT Committee was impressed by the additions of section information to the website. There are ongoing discussions about user impacts in the Roan Highlands between ATC, the Forest Service, the US Fish and Wildlife Service, and SAHC; we have participated in some of these discussions and will continue to be involved, with recommendations yet to be made. Protection of a large tract near Yellow Mountain Gap by SAHC will preserve views from the barn and the Trail leading off Grassy Ridge. We have submitted two grant proposals to LL Bean that we should learn about soon, and one to the NC AT license plate program that will be decided in April.

Reporting: Jake Mitchell **Date:** January 25, 2009 **Purpose:** Clear blowdown

Location: Section 9b, Hampton Blue Blaze and Laurel Fork Gorge

Summary: Our initial plan was to clear a large blowdown just before the AT/Hampton Blue Blaze intersection on the Blue Blaze. We got there and discovered that someone cut it out, most likely the Forest Service. We cleared some other brush from the sides of the trail and removed some trash.
