The Club is a member of the Appalachian Trail Conservancy and maintains a section of the Appalachian Trail from Spivey Gap, North Carolina, to Damascus, Virginia. This accounts for about 127 miles of treadway.

The Club is a nonprofit outdoors club, founded in 1946, offering a year-round program of activities, including day hikes, backpacking, paddling trips, camping, caving, mountain biking, social gatherings, and trail maintenance. - ♦ Club-organized First Aid Certification courses
- ◆ Northeast Tennessee Public Lands Day
- ◆ Special community service projects, including construction and maintenance of local trails
- Cosponsorship with Carolina Mountain Club and Smoky Mountain Hiking Club of "South Beyond 6000," which honors those who hike 40 of the highest peaks in the Southeast U.S.

TEHCC is organized under the auspices of the Eastman Recreation Club for the benefit of Eastman Chemical Company employees, retirees, and their families. Membership requirements consist of concurrent membership in the Recreation Club and payment of annual dues. Others not affiliated with Eastman are welcome to participate in club activities as a Program Affiliate.




